Screaming and running after it, she threw her ticket down in disgust, then walked over to a bench, sat down, and cried. Her boyfriend came over to talk to her, and she yelled, "How would you feel if you were pregnant and missed the bus with the next one coming in 18 hours? What am I supposed to do, ignore my feelings?" This really got my attention. I've heard that last part myself.

I felt like I was in front of a stage watching something unfold. Getting an inner nudge to help them, I walked over and offered to drive them home if they would follow me to my hotel. I explained we were from out of town for a seminar and that my wife's map software would direct us to wherever they needed to go. They agreed, so I called my wife and we all met in front of our hotel.

While I drove, my wife began coaching the young couple. She said to the young man, "The most important thing you can say is, 'What I hear you say is. . . ." She asked them how they met, then offered them the HU. Our map software was set to British English, so I had a lot of problems figuring out where the "slip road on the left" was. It took three trips around the block before my wife pointed out where to turn. I've never been so confused in my life.

We provided an active example of good listening right before their eyes as I asked my wife for clarification at other turning points as well. I asked her to change the app from British English to American English, but she couldn't find that menu item. She tried a couple of times, but then we had to get back to the task at hand. At one point I looked in the rearview mirror and I could see the couple hugging each other in our back seat. I felt they could relate to our problems in communication and were feeling much better about their own.

We dropped them off near their home, thinking that we are often in the right place at the right time to share the HU and other struggles with those who need it most. It later occurred to me that this spiritual connection begins with the spiritual lesson of listening—to each other and to the Mahanta's inner guidance. \*
