Which key will fit in the lock?



Two weeks ago, I was in the post office getting my mail. A father came in with his daughter. She was really small, and in her hand she held a key.


The child ran back and forth across the lobby, trying her key in all the different mailboxes that lined the room. I went over to my box and put my key in to get the mail out. The little girl came over and stood beside me, watching. She thought it was very interesting: My key worked when hers hadn't.

I shut my mailbox, and the father scooped up his little girl and started out the door. He said to me, "When you're this age and you've got a key, the whole world is a lock." We both laughed at this.

Later I was thinking about what he had said, trying to unlock the spiritual meaning. I realized that for a child the whole world is an opportunity. It's something to unlock. The child is always asking life, "Will my key work here?"

It's this childlike attitude—that the whole world is an opportunity—that makes life a joy to live.

In this spiritual exercise, you practice keeping an open heart throughout everyday life. It's very tough; I have to work at it all the time too.



The habit of love is catching; it builds, gains momentum, and becomes easier. But like a plant that needs watering and loving care every day, the habit of love takes constant attention.


Love won't come through unless the heart is open. To work with an open heart is to love or care for something or someone more than you do for yourself. This is the first step to the divine love that we are looking for.


